John 5 – Healing at the Pool

- 1. After this there was a Jewish feast, and Jesus went up to Jerusalem. ²Now there is in Jerusalem by the Sheep Gate a pool called Bethzatha in Aramaic, which has five covered walkways. ³A great number of sick, blind, lame, and paralyzed people were lying in these walkways.
- 5. Now a man was there who had been disabled for thirty-eight years. ⁶When Jesus saw him lying there and when he realized that the man had been disabled a long time already, he said to him, "Do you want to become well?" ⁷The sick man answered him, "Sir, I have no one to put me into the pool when the water is stirred up. While I am trying to get into the water, someone else goes down there before me." ⁸Jesus said to him, "Stand up! Pick up your mat and walk." ⁹Immediately the man was healed, and he picked up his mat and started walking.

Now that day was a Sabbath,

- 10. so the Jewish leaders said to the man who had been healed, "It is the Sabbath, and you are not permitted to carry your mat." ¹¹But he answered them, "The man who made me well said to me, 'Pick up your mat and walk."" ¹²They asked him, "Who is the man who said to you, 'Pick up your mat and walk'?" ¹³But the man who had been healed did not know who it was, for Jesus had slipped out, since there was a crowd in that place.
- 14. **After this** Jesus found him at the temple and said to him, "Look, you have become well. Don't sin any more, lest a worse thing come upon you." ¹⁵The man went away and informed the Jewish leaders that Jesus was the one who had made him well.
- 16. Now because Jesus was doing these things on the Sabbath, the Jewish leaders began persecuting him. ¹⁷So he told them, "My **Father** is working until now, and I too am working." ¹⁸For this reason the Jewish leaders were trying even harder to kill him, because
 - not only was he breaking the Sabbath,
 - but he was also calling God his own **Father**, thus making himself equal with God.
- 19. So Jesus answered them, "I tell you the solemn truth, the Son can do nothing on <u>his own initiative</u>, but only what he sees the **Father** doing. For whatever the **Father** does, the Son does likewise. [The Father's initiative and will]
- 20. For the **Father** loves the Son and shows him everything he does, and will show him greater deeds than these, so that you will **be amazed**. ²¹For just as the **Father raises the dead and gives them life**, so also the Son gives life to whomever he wishes. [Power to create life from death]
- 22. Furthermore, the **Father** does not judge anyone, but <u>has assigned all judgment</u> to the Son, ²³so that all people will honor the Son just as they honor the **Father**. The one who does not honor the Son does not honor the **Father** who sent him. [Authority to judge]
- 24. "I tell you the solemn truth, the one who <u>hears my message and believes</u> the one who sent me <u>has eternal life and will not be condemned</u>, but has <u>crossed over from</u> <u>death to life</u>. [Receiving Jesus' words brings life]
- 25. I tell you the solemn truth, a time is coming—and is now here—when <u>the dead will hear</u> <u>the voice of the Son of God, and those who hear will live</u>. ²⁶For just as the Father has life in himself, thus he has granted the Son to have life in himself,
- 27. And he has assigned authority to execute judgment to the Son, because he is the Son of Man.
- 28. "Do not **be amazed** at this, because a time is coming when **all who are in the tombs will hear his voice** ²⁹**and will come out**—the ones who have done what is good to the resurrection resulting in life, and the ones who have done what is evil to the resurrection resulting in condemnation.
- I can do nothing on <u>my own initiative</u>. Just as I hear, I judge, and my judgment is just, because I do not seek my own will, but the will of the one who sent me.

Four Kinds of Evidence for Jesus

- 31. "If I testify about myself, my testimony is not true.
- 32. There is another who <u>testifies</u> about me, and I know the <u>testimony</u> he <u>testifies</u> about me is true. ³³You have sent to **John**, and he has <u>testified</u> to the truth. ³⁴(I do not accept human <u>testimony</u>, but I say this so that you may be saved.) ³⁵He was a lamp that was burning and shining, and you wanted to rejoice greatly for a short time in his light.
- 36. "But I have a <u>testimony</u> greater than that from John. For **the deeds** that the **Father** has assigned me to complete—**the deeds** I am now doing—<u>testify</u> about me that the **Father** has sent me.
- 37. And the Father who sent me has himself <u>testified</u> about me. You people have never heard his voice nor seen his form at any time, ³⁸nor do you have his word residing in you, because you do not believe the one whom he sent.
- 39. You study the **scriptures** thoroughly because you think in them you possess eternal life, and it is these same **scriptures** that <u>testify</u> about me, ⁴⁰but you are not willing to come to me so that you may have life.
- 41. "I do not accept praise from people, ⁴²but I know you, that you do not have the love of God within you. ⁴³I have come in my **Father**'s name, and you do not accept me. If someone else comes in his own name, you will accept him. ⁴⁴How can you believe, if you accept praise from one another and don't seek the praise that comes from the only God?
- 45. "Do not suppose that I will accuse you before the **Father**. The one who accuses you is **Moses**, in whom you have placed your hope. ⁴⁶If you believed **Moses**, you would believe me, because he wrote about me. ⁴⁷But if you do not believe what **Moses** wrote, how will you believe my words?"
